CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All entries to be entered online.
- 2. Entry and box fees by cash must accompany entry form or be deposited to account **12-32530106747-00** by internet banking before closing date.
- 3. Entry forms must be completed online and electronically signed personally by exhibitor who agrees to comply with both the Great Lakes All Welsh Show conditions of entry and the Cambridge Lodge Grounds.
- 4. Entries after closing date cannot be accepted except for Progeny Classes.
- 5. All entries to be registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of New Zealand Inc in either the Pure Bred or Part Bred register, including foals.
- 6. In all classes, where applicable, the name of the pony, age, sire, dam and Studbook number shall be given on the entry form. Those stallions and Geldings over the age of three (3) years with temporary numbers will not be eligible to enter. Ponies registered as geldings must be gelded. Stallions must be fully registered and not on Temp colt papers.
- 7. No Substitutions.
- 8. All stallions or colts 1 year and over must wear a bit and have a stallion tag on bridle, a bib and be handled by a person 15 years or over.
- 9. Boxes available for all entries. Refer "boxes" for further conditions.
- 10. Judging will commence at 9.00am unless otherwise stated.
- 11. The Judge's decision will be final.
- 12. Entrants not present for judging at the commencement of the class will not be admitted for judging. No classes will be held up.
- 13. No Colt or Stallion to be tied to Truck or float at any time. Stallion/colt owners must book a box with their entries.
- 14. The committee at its absolute discretion may refuse an entry or cancel an entry already accepted or decline to admit to the grounds or remove any animal or exhibitor from the said grounds.
- 15. The committee will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or inflicted by any animal, person or property.
- 16. The committee reserves the right to make any alteration to the program or postpone or cancel the show as it sees fit.
- 17. The committee reserves the right to amalgamate any classes where necessary.
- 18. Purebred ponies must not be plaited.
- 19. Helmets must be worn at all times when mounted, this includes on motorbikes, scooters and bicycles.
- 20. A refund of 75% (minus Evo Event compulsory fees) of entry fee will be given on the presentation of Vets certificate or Doctors certificate.
- 21. Horses must not be left unattended overnight. There must be a designated person in charge at all times.
- 22. Leave gates as you found them.
- 23. Bond For all boxes: There will be a stable bond added to your EvoEvents account after completion of the show and if your stable is not up to a satisfactory standard. will be inspected upon completion of the show and then the stable bond be added.
- 24. Keep off any newly grassed areas.
- 25. An ID tag is required for all ponies left on grounds overnight with contact phone number.
- 26. All Exhibitors must show courtesy for the duration of the show, this includes in season mares, stallions and colts.
- 27. Abuse will not be tolerated. Any abuse reported and the exhibitor may be asked to leave grounds.

The Great Lakes All Welsh Club Inc committee are proud to announce our show has been awarded the Hawker Medallion for the 2024/25 season in the North Island.

RON HAWKER AND THE WOODLIN WELSH COB STUD. (HAWKER MEDALLION)

Ron Hawker was of an age that he could remember horses of Cob type plying the streets of Christchurch doing daily rounds. The Hawker family had a large bakery business in Christchurch. Ron Hawker wanted to rekindle those horse drawn days; the idea of importing Welsh Cobs to New Zealand was a dream that became a reality.

He wrote a letter to Ann Wheatcroft of Sydenham Stud in England asking if she could secure a Welsh Cob stallion and a Welsh Cob mare that was in foal, to establish the Welsh Cob breed in New Zealand. Hewid Dafydd was a resident stallion at Sydenham, foaled in 1965, sired by the influential stallion Cahn

Dafydd and out of the top producing mare Chancerie Polly.



Hewid Dafydd arrived by ship to New Zealand in 1974. With few purebred mares available, Colleen Boston of Glynmawr Stud, leased the mare Te Rangi Dianthus to Ron Hawker to mate to Dafydd, the result a filly, Woodlin Cyntaf, foaled in December 1975. Cyntaf, being the first purebred daughter of Dafydd went back to Glynmawr Stud after Ron Hawker passed away, producing foals for Glynmawr Stud and later Waimarie Stud, Kaiwaka, Northland.

Broughton Gay Girl was a big bay mare by Cream Bank out of Cathedine Gwilth by Cathedine Flyer, so 100% Cob blood for many generations. Gay Girl arrived in New Zealand in 1976, producing the bay roan colt, Woodlin Beau Brummel soon after arrival. Beau Brummel being sired by Llanarth Brummel, Ann Wheatcrofts own stallion, Royal Welsh Champion in 1964 and 1965, also a prolific winner under saddle in Britain.

The first Dafydd x Gay Girl foal arrived in 1977, a bay colt, Woodlin Rounull. Hewid Dafydd was also made available to outside mares, one important mare to visit was Robin and Dianna Bruce's Manorshire Little Model, an over height Section A mare who was to become the dam of Kinkora Nell Gwynne, foaled in 1977. Nell Gwynne was sold to Paul and Colleen Rebay a foundation mare for their Lorien Stud in Taranaki.

Ron Hawker saw Cobs reintroduced to New Zealand but passed away in 1977 after a long illness. He bequeathed his beloved Cobs to The Welsh Pony & Cob Society of New Zealand.

As already mentioned, Woodlin Cyntaf returned to Glynmawr Stud, Woodlin Beau Brummel found his way to Bert and Verna Moore's Evermore Stud in Morrinsville where he stood at stud for the rest of his life.

The Council of the Society, in their wisdom maintained that Dafydd and Gay Girl must stay together as a pair as not to fragment the breed any further. Bert Moore, as President of the Society visited every member of the Society during a tour of New Zealand to make sure everyone agreed with the decision to sell Hewid Dafydd and Broughton Gay Girl also the colt foal Woodlin Rounull. The proceeds from the sale have been invested and the Interest has helped The Welsh Pony & Cob Society of New Zealand to continue in a prosperous manner thanks to those members of the time.

As a gesture the Hawker Medallion was struck, the medallions would be awarded, one for each Island, to the Champion at the Welsh Pony & Cob Shows, providing that there were six or more Cobs exhibited on the day.

The Medallion is awarded provided there are at least 6 Cobs entered and exhibited on the day.

The winners of these classes then compete for the Supreme Championship, with the top pony receiving the Gold Medal and Rosette.
